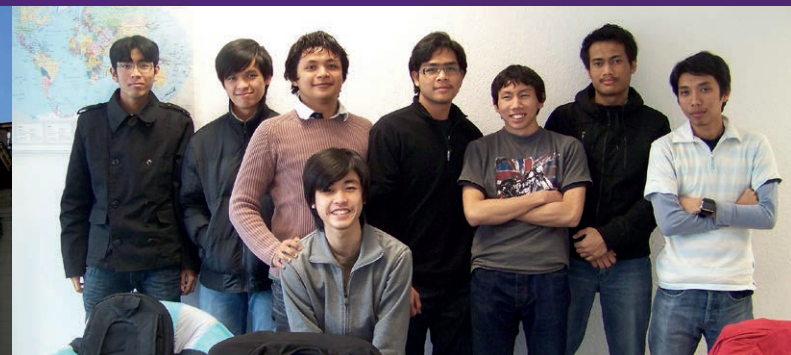

## GERMAN HIGHER EDUCATION SYSTEM



Germany is one of the world's best study destinations. There are many good reasons why you should choose Germany to continue your higher education abroad:

- 1. Quality of life** – You live in a diverse, safe country in the heart of Europe.
- 2. Booming economy** – Germany is the largest economy in Europe and a world export leader.
- 3. Engineering and innovation leader** – Germany is the global leader in numerous high-tech fields and is one of the top three countries for international patent registration.
- 4. Diverse range of study opportunities** – Choose from about 400 universities and Universities of Applied Sciences offering more than 19,000 different degree courses.

- 6. First-rate higher education system** – Germany is the fourth most popular study destination worldwide – for good reason.
- 7. Top class degree recognized around the world** – “Made in Germany” is recognized as an international seal of quality. A German university degree is highly respected by employers worldwide.
- 8. Good career prospects** – Knowledge of German increases your job opportunities with German and foreign companies in your own country and abroad. There are over 400 German companies operating in Malaysia.
- 9. Open and proactive cultural exchange** – Germany is ranked in the top three countries worldwide with the largest foreign student population.
- 10. No tuition fees** – In most cases, there are no tuition fees for German and international students.

Carl Duisberg Centren has organized study preparation courses for Malaysian SPM holders on behalf of Jabatan Perkhidmatan Awam (JPA) and Telekom Malaysia Berhad for more than 20 years.

The study program consists of two parts with a total duration of 26 months.

### In Malaysia (Bandar Sunway) – starting in July

- **Module I:** 6-month intensive German language course with a native speaker.
- **Module II:** 12-month Western Australian Matriculation Course (AUSMAT) with additional German language courses.
- Intercultural preparation.
- Accommodation and classes at Sunway College, Bandar Sunway.

### In Germany (Cologne) – starting in January

#### Module III:

- Intensive German language course and preparation for an official German language examination (C1 level)
- Bridging course in Physics, Mathematics, and Chemistry in German language.
- Extensive educational counseling and personal mentoring.
- Placement in internships at German companies (if obligatory).
- Placement at universities and Universities of Applied Sciences all over Germany.
- Accommodation in Germany.

German curricula emphasize independent studies. Students are expected to do independent research, prepare oral reports or term papers and attend lectures and small group discussions.

### Most common types of higher education institutions in Germany

- Universities and Technical Universities (“TU”) emphasize theoretical research.
- Universities of Applied Sciences (“FH”) emphasize practical knowledge and maintain close relations to the industries.

### Most common degree courses

- Bachelor Degrees normally take 6 or 7 semesters (3 to 3.5 years) to complete. The most common Bachelor Degrees in Germany are B.A. (Bachelor of Arts), B.Sc. (Bachelor of Science) and B.Eng. (Bachelor of Engineering).
- Master Degrees are consecutive to a Bachelor Degree and can be earned in 2 to 4 semesters (1 to 2 years). A Master Degree is usually a specialization relating to the Bachelor subject. A Master Degree program can be entered immediately upon completion of a Bachelor Degree or following a few years of work experience.
